Early on visitors were offered a small knitted angel with a Christian message to take home and over the years thousands have gone all over the world. This is an appeal for knitters around the District to join in with 'angel production'. They are very easy to knit!

Double knitting wool and size 8 needles (4mm)

Cast on 36 stitches.

Row 1 k Row 2 p Row 3 k

Row 4 (p2tog. p7) to end

Row 5 k Row 6 p Row 7 k

Row 8 (p2tog. P6) to end

Row 9 k Row 10 p Row 11 k

Row 12 (p2tog p5) to end

Row 13 k Row 14 p Row 15 k

Row 16 (p2tog p4) to end

Row 17 k Row 18 p Row 19 k

Row 20 p

Row 21 k Change wool for head if wished

Row 22 p Row 23 k Row 24 p

Row 25 k Row 26 p

Row 27 knit 2 tog to end.

Row 28 p Row 29 k Row 30 p2tog to end.

Thread remaining 5 stitches tog. on darning needle

Small Wings

Cast on 21 stitches

Row 1 k

Row 2 k

Row 3 k2 tog. K to last 2 stitches k2 tog

Row 4 k Row 5 k2 tog to last 2 stitches k 2 tog

Continue to decrease at each end of every row until all stitches worked off.

To form the head, thread through R22, stuff the head lightly, pull the thread tightly and tie securely.

Sew up back and add wings.
