

North Kirklees & Morley Circuit September 2025

When somebody asked Jesus a question or he heard them complaining, they often received a story in reply. For instance, the parable of the Good Samaritan (Luke 10:25-37) was an answer for someone puzzled about the meaning of 'your neighbour'.

Luke chapter 15, gives a group of three stories which Jesus told in response to complaints about who he mixed with: a shepherd searches high and low for one lost sheep; a woman keeps on sweeping and looking for a coin until it is discovered; a father waits until his lost son eventually returns home. In these stories, Jesus painted a picture of a world in which every person matters, whoever they are, whatever they have done. Those whom some consider lost and worth leaving behind are precious to God and worth the cost of seeking out.

Through stories, Jesus gave his listeners something to ponder. He made what he said memorable. But his stories go further than that because they allow us to glimpse a different way of seeing the world and understanding the possibilities of what could be. In the parable of the mustard seed (Matthew 13:31-32), the tiniest seed grows into a tree large enough to

provide shelter for the birds which come. The parable of the yeast (Matthew 13:33) shows the considerable effect that just a small amount can have through a large quantity. In the parable of the workers in the vineyard (Matthew 20:1-16), at the end of the day, all the workers receive what they need. Through his stories, Jesus offered messages of hope. As he painted word pictures in which the lost are found, the tiny amount makes a significant difference and everyone has what they need, Jesus showed people the world as God has made it and as God desires it to be.

At the beginning of a new church year, I wonder what lies ahead of us. What are the pictures of hope which we feel inspired to paint? If we can picture something, then we are more likely to find our way towards it.

Each time Jesus' stories are read and shared, their vision of welcome, inclusion and generous provision can come a step nearer. This is because stories can inspire and change the way that we live in the world. These messages of hope, when taken to heart, help us to see how to live lives which make a difference in the way God invites us to.

Take a few moments to imagine how you would like the world around you to be this time next year... as you let your imagination work, what hopes do you see? What are the important things to hold onto? Allowing God to prompt your thinking, what could you/we do to bring that vision of hope a bit nearer? When we look back this time next year, we may

find ourselves marvelling at what God has been able to do through our lives and our churches. Please feel encouraged to share your hopes, dreams, thoughts and inspirations. May God in Christ and through the Holy Spirit keep on helping us to see the hope that is before us. With love and prayers,

Batley Central are seeking to appoint an Outreach Development Worker to work with them on a fixed term contract for 3 years. The successful candidate will work in partnership with the church and local community to develop an outreach programme and recruit volunteers to support the services that are developed. They will support the Church Leadership Team and congregation to deliver the church's mission.

Main Responsibilities:

- Develop specific services to benefit the community.

- Recruit and work with volunteers to support the work.

The Prayer Quilt Ministry is going from strength to strength as churches around the Circuit continue to request prayer quilts on behalf of members of their congregation, friends, family and community.

It is a joy to create the quilts, from sourcing fabric to the final stage of stitching on the label. The team gather weekly to cut, iron and stitch, and offer support to one another. This ministry is so much more than creating beautiful quilts for deserving people. At

its very heart it is a ministry of prayer, which is why the quilts are presented to the local church, and congregations are encouraged to say a quiet prayer for the recipient as they tie a knot on the quilt (which is required to hold all three layers together!).

71 prayer quilts have been created since the setting up of this Circuit ministry, and there are more in the pipeline. If you know anyone who is ill, bereaved, confined to home or going through a difficult time in their life and would appreciate the gift of a
