A few weeks ago, I went to the cinema with my daughter to watch *The Penguin Lessons* based on Tom Michell's 2015 memoirs, chronicling his experience as a British teacher who travelled to South America to teach at a boy's boarding school in Argentina in the 1970s.

When Michell arrives, he is unhappy in his work and struggles to engage with the boys. When the school is shut for a few days, he takes a trip to Uruguay where he stumbles across many dead penguins soaked with oil. He notices one is still alive, takes it back to his hotel and cleans him up. However, when he tries to return the bird to the sea, the penguin is having none of it, and before he knows it, Tom has returned to Argentina reluctantly smuggling it back to school in his luggage. He doesn't yet know it but this penguin will change his life. Michell adopts the penguin, naming it Juan Salvador. He eventually introduces Juan to his class, which succeeds in making them pay attention and excel in their studies. It is a moving story.

God can surprise us with the things or people he uses to help us change direction. The unplanned

and unexpected events, though sometimes hard and challenging, can also set the stage for growth and change. Rerouted paths can bring us closer to our true purpose and places of joy.

When Abraham was 99 years old, God promised him that Sarah would bear a child, and one day their descendants would number as many as the stars. When Sarah learned of the promise, she laughed, disbelieving that a woman of her age could bear a child. Yet, a year later, Sarah gave birth to Isaac.

When Simon Peter was fishing one night and caught nothing, he had no idea that the next day Jesus would provide a huge catch of fish and then call him to give up fishing and learn a whole new way of life.

When Mary's had a visit from an angel who disrupted her wedding plans, she had no idea that she would become the mother of the Saviour of the world.

When Mary Magdalene went to anoint Jesus' body at the tomb, she was hurt and shocked to find the body gone until a gardener gave her the job of being the first witness to the resurrection. As we navigate through our faith, we often encounter moments that catch us off guard. These unexpected events can challenge our understanding, deepen our reliance on God, and encourage us to trust in His plan for our lives. Romans 8:28 says," And we know that in all things God works for the good of those who love him, who have been called according to his purpose." Even when we face difficult surprises in our lives, we can trust that God is working for our good. Are we open to the unexpected? I am sure that amongst us there are lots of testimonies to share with each other. Can you share with someone a time when God did something unexpected in your life and your direction changed for the better? God has great plans for us if we are open to them and trust in him.
