

North Kirklees & Morley Circuit MAY 2025

From Rev. Dr. David Barker:

Since I've had to spend an unfortunately large amount of time over the last couple of weeks in hospital waiting rooms, I've had a lot of time to listen in surreptitiously to other people's conversations. Some have been fascinating and some have been dreadfully dull, but at least people were talking to one another. Another conversation this week revealed that a friend on holiday had struck up another conversation with a stranger in a sauna in Japan and discovered that they knew one another at university and that my friend knew the niece of the fellow sauna dweller. It is, as they say, good to talk.

Over the season of Lent, we've been having some splendid conversations around the Circuit as we have hosted our Susanna's Table events. Over lunch, and helped on by a card game which, like some Ministers, took a little getting to understand but turned out to be popular in the end, dozens of people talked to one another. Some of those were regulars at our churches, and some were not, but all valued the chance to have meaningful and often deep conversations, to listen to one another and to be listened to.

As we think of conversations, perhaps we are reminded of the travellers on the road to Emmaus on the first Easter Sunday. I have always found, both as a teacher and as a parent, that some of the easiest and best conversations have happened while I been walking with someone: perhaps it's something to do with being side-by-side and not directly facing one another; perhaps it's because the walking makes silences easier and less oppressive. It was in conversation that those travellers met with Jesus and found their lives changed. For them, it was good to talk.

The Early Church spread largely through conversations in its first few decades too. The general view among scholars is that Christianity spread throughout the Roman Empire mostly not as a result of preaching and mass conversions, but through personal introductions, invitations and conversations within households and workplaces. So for us, as we face increasing indifference and sometimes even hostility, what is going to work for us as we struggle to reach out to people who have not yet worked out what a relationship with Christ through his Church could mean for them? The rallies and outdoor preaching events of years gone by are out of the question. Yes, we do need to up our game in terms of the woeful advertising that goes out in the name of our churches, but that reaches a limited audience too. Just sitting where we are and wondering why people are not coming doesn't seem to be doing the trick, does it?

Perhaps, then, we need to invest time and energy in some conversations with people we know and live among? We need to talk up our churches and be upbeat about them. We need to invite people to church, personally, and even offer to bring them. We need to gossip the Gospel to the people around us, because it really is good to talk.
